### **Description of School**

Grinnell College is a private, four-year liberal arts college that provides a once-in-a-lifetime intellectual experience within an intentionally diverse community. Of the 1,700 students, 20 percent come from outside the United States and 25 percent are domestic students of color. Students pursue intellectual journeys as unique as they are; outside of the requirements of a major, Grinnell has only one required course, the First-Year Tutorial. Professors mentor students through the special demands of our individually-advised curriculum. Nearly half the students pursue independent research or creative work with a faculty member. More than half of our students study off-campus. Global learning takes place on and off campus. Campus life hums at its own idiosyncratic frequency. Each year, students choose how to spend more than \$400,000 to fund students clubs, organizations, and activities. One-third of students participate in 20 NCAA Division III sports and two-thirds participate in intramural or club sports. Students also pursue a variety of social justice activities through student organizations, service learning projects, and internships. Grinnell is committed to making education accessible to those with demonstrated financial need.
