Millsaps College is a small Liberal Arts institution in the capital city of Jackson, Mississippi. Millsaps College was founded in 1890 and has been a beacon of light and hope for the state of Mississippi for the past 126 years. Currently, the College has 36 majors and 42 minors, providing students with many different options. The school is committed to academic excellence, with some of the best faculty in the country, a small student to faculty ratio of 8:1, small class sizes that average at just 12 students, and great on-campus support services. Recently, Millsaps College was named the best school in the state of Mississippi by Forbes Magazine, cementing its efforts as a small Liberal Arts institution to provide students with strong academics, open inquiry, and free expression.
